Fall Challenge Theme: Repurpose

Challenge Due Date: December guild meeting, Dec. 12 (pictures due Dec. 10 – see instructions below)

Challenge Overview:

- 1. make an item using repurposed material from one or more of the following: article(s) of clothing, an old quilt that has fallen into disrepair, etc.
- 2. item made can be a small quilt (minimum 12"x12"; maximum 36"x45"), tote bag or zipper pouch, pincushion, rug mug or table topper, a new article of clothing other than the original item the material was taken from, or any other useful item you can think of!

Challenge Instructions:

- 1. take pictures of the original item(s) from which you are taking your repurposed material
- 2. make your item using your repurposed material and any other materials needed to complete the item (the final item must be made from at least 50% repurposed material)
- 3. take pictures of the new item
- 1. submit your pictures and the name of any patterns used or note if the item is your own design (email no later than Sunday, Dec. 10 to RQGSpecialEvent@gmail.com)
- 2. bring your completed item to the December guild meeting for display
- 3. members will vote for the top 3 entries
- 4. challenge winners will be announced at the December meeting and will receive a prize

Hello Members.

The pictures of auction items are trickling in. I would really love to have more. Please use the contact info below to get the pictures to me and then posted!

I learned a helpful tip this summer from my SIL who just retired from teaching. I noticed she had taken up cross stitch and was using her phone for the pattern. The pattern image was staying open while she stitched.

I never had that luck whether it be recipes or sewing or quilting patterns. She told me her method and I have been using it ever since. On most of our phones or tablets there is an orange icon with an open white page spread on it. The app is called books. If you save your pattern to that page and open it stays open.

Every day I get an email from a pattern maker SewCanShe or @sewcanshe on Instagram. Each day there is a free pattern. If I like the pattern, I scroll all the way to the end of the instructions and tap on the pink bar. When the blue arrow in a box shows up, I tap, and it takes me to a choice of apps ...one of those is the orange book app. I send the pattern to the app. This is a great way to have your patterns on the go...maybe when you are shopping for supplies, stitching while waiting for an appointment, or creating while on vacation.
