Philanthropy Report

As we look back at the year, June 2020 to May 2021, we are grateful and amazed at the contributions of time and materials given to philanthropy from guild members and nonmembers. The guild donated 148 quilts, 150 holiday stockings, 16 pet beds, and 96 pillowcases. That was an increase of 54% in guilts and a 270% in pillowcases. New donations were holiday stockings and pet beds. Applause to everyone involved. Donations go to various organizations in DuPage, Will and Kane Counties. We are looking forward to increasing the organizations we donate too. Suggestions are welcome. We start the new year with a new organization and county to add to our list. Share our Spare is located in Chicago, Cook County, where a total of 41 receiving blankets, 199 burp bibs and 25 changing pads were donated. Other donations this month were 11 quilts to Silver Cross Hospital children's unit in Joliet, 11 quilts to Will County Children's Advocacy Center in Joliet, and 2 pet beds to ADOPT in Naperville.

We are able to continue our donations through the efforts of guild members and nonmembers. We received 11 complete quilts from Linda Y. (look in Facebook and Instagram for a couple of

pictures), 26 receiving blankets, 50 burp bibs, and 25 changing pads from Quilt Angel, 13 blankets, 128 burp bibs from Rosemary S., and 4 quilted tops from Terri H. We thank everyone for their contributions and hope we recognize everyone. If we left anyone out, please let us know. We appreciate the time and effort of all members. Our Facebook and Instagram committee members are looking for pictures, don't be shy.


A Spotlight on July 13, 2021
