#### Riverwalk Quilt Guild Challenge - Spring 2022: Monochromatic Quilts

It's time for a Riverwalk Quilt Guild Challenge! The theme this year is Monochromatic Quilts.

This challenge was inspired by an exhibit of quilts made in Brazil in 2016. For an idea of the wide range of quilts that can be made in one color, you can view some of those quilts online at: <a href="http://paulmanley.org/brasil/index.html">http://paulmanley.org/brasil/index.html</a>

Note that there are links at the bottom of the web page for "Gallery 1," "Gallery 2," and "Gallery 3." Click on each of the Gallery links to see the quilts.

Challenge rules are as follows:

- 1. The challenge is open to Riverwalk Quilters Guild members only.
- 2. Quilts or quilted items should be no larger than 400 square inches. (For example, either a 20" x 20" quilt or a 40" x 10" quilt is 400 square inches.) Pieces do not need to be square or flat.
- 3. Quilts should be made using only one color of fabric. Multiple shades, tones, and tints of the color may be included. The quilt should not include a second color. For purposes of this challenge, black and white are considered to be colors.
- 4. The piece should include at least some quilting stitches to connect the top, batting and backing layers.
- 5. Any techniques may be used to create the quilt, including but not limited to piecing, applique, embroidery, embellishment and quilting.
- 6. Tentatively, the due date for submission is May 3, 2022 (one week prior to the May 10, 2022, meeting). The due date may be moved to a later date, no later than June 14, 2022, depending upon whether the May and/or June 2022 meetings will be in person or online. The final due date will be announced in the Guild newsletter.
- 7. First, second and third prizes will be awarded. The method for identifying winners (viewers' choice, judging or random selection) will depend upon whether the challenge quilts are shown at an in-person or online meeting.



Yvonne has been a physical therapist for 40 years and is board certified in orthopedic physical therapy - and yes, a quilter. Yvonne understands the stress we can impose on our body as we pursue our creative passion. Her program Includes ergonomic and posture strategies for quilters with emphasis on the shoulders, shoulder blades and neck. The interactive lecture will highlight the common pitfalls of workstation setup with strategies for improvement. Ideal ergonomic positioning and posture will be demonstrated. Common patterns of muscle strength/length and resting postural changes will be illustrated along with basic exercise concepts to restore balance.

Meeting will be Live - In Person. Sarah's formal study of art was in the area of visual arts for her undergraduate work and her emphasis in graduate school was in painting. Mix all ingredients together; put in crock pot or can also use a baking dish and heat in oven. Serve when cheese is melted.




