It was a fun time.

The philanthropy sew- in was the first in person gathering for Guild members of the 2023 year. Sewing machines were humming and people were enjoying catching up and getting to know new members. There was also an opportunity for a group to gather and discuss creating a Bee group. In some areas it is known as a friendship circle. The project this year was to sew quilt tops. We had 47 pre-cut kits with instructions for members to sew. We brought back 8 kits to be distributed another time. Thank you to the Guild members that attended and contributed their time to create future donations to the community.

This month we distributed 27 quilts, 1 pillowcase and 2 hand warmers. The organizations that received these items were, Habitat for Humanity, Fox Valley, Northwestern Medical Center, Winfield, Ronald McDonald House, Winfield, Sharing Connection, Downers Grove, and Monarch Landing, Naperville. We received, 19 quilt tops, 1 pillowcase, 4 completed quilts, fabric donation, 8 bound quilts, and 3 quilts. Fourteen quilts had labels put on them. You do not have to own a longarm machine to finish these quilts. There are many sizes that are domestic machine friendly. They are colorful baby/kids quilts. Some are lap sizes that go to people that are wheelchair bound. The more that are completed, the more we can distribute. Please consider taking one, or two.

RWQG Challenge with Lacy Delicacies – Challenge Entry Date is now April 10

Let's have a strong showing for our 22-23 challenge regarding the delicate lacy items donated by Darlene Schille. Many of you (at least 20) chose a doily or the like at the Guild meeting in 2022. Our deadline has moved around a bit but this is our time to reveal.

Vintage Lacy Challenge details

- 1. Lacy item can be modified, embellished or may even become the embellishment. Use over 1/2 of chosen piece. Consider the possibility of unraveling, if only using a portion.
- 2. Some quilting is required on your project, but it isn't needed on the lacy or vintage handwork piece.
- 3. Size: The outside perimeter of any chosen shape is between 12" and 144". For instance, the 12" perimeter is equivalent to a 3-inch square item. The 144" perimeter is equivalent to 3-foot square item.
- 4. Picture is due for the April Guild meeting.

No application process is needed; just submit project photo(s) for inclusion in a April meeting slide show - a process similar to submitting pics to last year's show-n-tell. **Photo(s) should be emailed to Yvette Thorn at <u>yvettethorn80@gmail.com</u> by Monday afternoon at 5pm, April 10. Bring your challenge to the meeting in April if you are attending in-person so we can see also see your item close-up and personal as well as in the slide show.**


Enjoy the challenge. To keep the reveal uncomplicated between both zoom and in-person members, there is no voting, just compliments.
