

Coming in September:


Discover the Joys of Foundation Paper Piecing!

Philanthropy

There was a plethora, (one of my favorite words), of receiving and giving. This was the most we received at one time. Thank you guild members: Lyn S., Carol R., Norma B., Bev. P., Judy L., Donna M., Terri H., Vicki L., Tracy H., Deb. O., Yvette T., Darlene E., Sandy B., Loraine N., Sandy D., Lyn K., Beck K., Linda Y., Margaret Z., Nancy L., Leesa J., Wanda J. Linda M., and Lynn H.

We distributed 30 quilts to the following organizations: Northwest Medical Center, Winfield, Ronald McDonald House, Winfield, Silver Cross Hospital, New Lenox, Dupage Habitat for Humanity, and Will County Children Advocacy, Joliet.

The quilts we distribute are labeled identifying them as made by our guild, location, and the year they were made. Judy does all the labeling. This month she labeled 36 quilts. If you have not seen the labeled quilts, stop by our table, and we will show you. It is a nice opportunity to spread the work of our guild.

July 2021 – June 2022 distribution report:

195 quilts, 62 pillowcases, 29 stockings, 11 hand warmers, 7 pet beds, 412 burp cloths and 66 receiving blankets.

We had a 31% increase in quilt distribution. The Share our Spare is an organization a quilt member suggested as an organization to receive donations. They received burp cloths and receiving blankets.

Along with adding organizations that we distribute to, we have created pre-cut kits to sew quilt tops. Thank you Norma for researching friendly fun patterns and making up kits. The kits have helped inspire guild members to continue to be involved in giving to the community.

We thank you, guild members, for the time and materials donated to philanthropy.

It will be at Knox Presbyterian Church, fellowship hall. It will be an afternoon event from 1:00 – 5:00 p.m. Join us for the 4 hours or any part of that time.

We will be making Christmas stockings and pillowcases. We currently have 6 local organizations that we can distribute these items to families.

Judy and I were inspired by this project by the amount of holiday fabric available and mostly by the offer to help from Nancy and Amy. Nancy cut and sewed 217 stockings, and Amy cut and pressed 122 pillowcase kits.

Bring your sewing machines and supplies you will need to sew these projects. If you do not want to sew, you can help cut and iron. We will have irons and cutting areas. This is a wonderful opportunity to gather as a group and create gifts for area families.

We will provide water bottles and packaged snacks. You are welcome to bring your own beverage.

We thank the board for supporting and financing this event. It is one of the many advantages of being a member of the guild.

Please consider donating new small quilted items for our Quilt Auction and Gift Boutique as this is our major fundraiser for the year. We would appreciate all donations be given to us by October 11, 2022 to give us time to catalog and post items on-line for advertising purpose. Items popular in past auctions, include: table runners or toppers, baby quilts, lap quilts, wall hangings, gift bags, place mats, purses, pouches, wallets, bowl cozies, bottle openers, potato bags, wine cozies, tote bags, etc. Think of upcoming holidays, birthdays, baby showers, anniversaries. Best ideas are items that you would like to own yourself.

Instead of auctioning off all the items, we are adding a gift boutique for the smaller items that don't auction off as well because they draw smaller bids and don't make the best use of our limited auction time. We will look at past auctions and determine which items fit in this category. Some of these items may be bowl cozies, pot holders, small bags, etc. We will place reasonable prices on each of these items and give guests the ability to buy them straight out during the evening. We believe these items will make great gifts for the holidays and still make our guild money.

Please bring your completed items with the attached auction donation form in this month's email. A legible description of the item... and maybe the pattern or inspiration is always a way to create bid interest. Please find the <u>auction donation form</u> on our web site. In addition, we will have them available at the next few meetings.

We have the auctioneer and hall booked. Now, we need you to sign-up for a volunteer spot. A clipboard will be passed at the next few meetings seeking your help to make the auction and boutique runs smoothly.

Quilt Auction for Beginners

If you are new to the guild, this is how our auction works. At 6:00 PM, the donated quilt items are displayed and numbered in Grace's, Fellowship Hall, for bidders to preview. Upon your arrival, you receive a bidder number on a paddle or card. This bidder number is your identification for the rest of the evening. You raise the bidder paddle to indicate your wish to bid on an item during the auction. The bidder number is attached to all items that you win. Once you received your bidder number, preview all the items being auctioned. Note the numbers of the items you wish to bid on for referencing during the auction.

The auction starts at 7:00 PM, when our professional auctioneer, Matt Hart, calls for the first item. The first item is shown and it's number is given. Pay attention when an item you wish to bid on is next to be auctioned, as items are auctioned in number order. The auctioneer starts with an opening bid on the item. If you want to bid that price, raise your bidder card. Matt will point at the person whose has the current winning bid. The auctioneer will raise the price and look for the next bidder at that bid. It continues like this until no one wants to bid higher. If you are claimed to be the winner, raise your bidder card. Matt will note the winning price and bidder number. Your bidding number will be associated with that item which can be retrieved at the end of the auction. In addition, you may want to note the item number and your bid. The next item is shown and the auction continues until all items are gone.

Upon the auction completion, enter the cashier line for your bidder number. The cashier shows you the list of your winning items and their prices. This is where you can compare these to your notes that you were suggested to take. You can pay for your items with cash, check, or credit card. Once your payment is received, you are handed your items. Now you are an auction pro!

Hope to see you at our auction and quilt boutique.


