The auction/boutique was a huge success! Many thanks to all who donated quilts and food and volunteered at the auction.

There were 82 bidder cards given out at the event with 47 members and 35 guest obtaining them. 86% of non-member attendees reported that they learned about the auction from a Guild member. The net income for the auction was \$3808 and for the boutique was \$588 with the total being \$4396.

RWQG challenge with lacy delicacies.

Now that our projects for the Small Quilt Auction are behind us, we have time to focus on projects created with the delicate lacy items donated by Darlene Schille. Many of you chose a doily or the like at the Guild meeting in July and August. We still have more items available to choose from at the November and December meetings. You may also use your own treasure. So if you were waiting to start a new project until the auction was over, that moment is now! Interestingly, our challenge is possibly "trending." A recent "best of show" incorporated old lace. Margaret Solomon Gunn created Sweet Madame Blue. A close-up of the award-winning quilt is shown. What inspiration!



Vintage Lacy Challenge details

- 1. Lacy item can be modified, embellished or may even become the embellishment. Use over 1/2 of chosen piece. Consider the possibility of unraveling, if only using a portion.
- 2. Some quilting is required on your project, but it isn't needed on the lacy or vintage handwork piece.
- 3. Size: The outside perimeter of any chosen shape is between 12" and 144". For instance, the 12" perimeter is equivalent to a 3-inch square item. The 144" perimeter is equivalent to 3-foot square item.
- 4. Picture is due for the March Guild meeting.

No application process is needed; just submit project photo(s) for inclusion in a March (a revised due date) slide show - a process similar to submitting pics to last year's show-n-tell. The reveal via a slide show will be at our March meeting. Photo(s) should be emailed to Yvette Thorn at vvettethorn80@gmail.com by Monday afternoon at 5pm, March 13. Bring your challenge to the meeting in March if you are attending inperson so we can see also see your item close-up and personal as well as in the slide show.


Library News




Hello Quilters!
