

Fall 2022 Challenge by Sew 'n Tell Bee



We have a wonderful selection of handwork donated by Darlene Schille. Choose one lacy or handwork piece at July meeting, where we will meet only in-person. Some pieces could be offered to bees, if desired, after the July meeting.

- 1. Lacy item can be modified, embellished or may even become the embellishment. Use over 1/2 of chosen piece. Consider the possibility of unraveling, if only using a portion.
- 2. Some quilting is required on your project, but it isn't needed on the lacy or handwork piece. Extra cotton fabric will be available at the July meeting.
- 3. Size: The outside perimeter of any chosen shape is between 12" and 144". For instance, the 12" perimeter is equivalent to a 3-inch square item. The 144" perimeter is equivalent to 3-foot square item.

Due at the November Guild meeting. All participants should send a digital photo(s) to a show 'n tell person. Date and time for digital photos will be in a future newsletter. And those attending in-person for the Zoom speaker at Knox should also bring their challenge piece to the November meeting.

The RQG library will be available at the July meeting at Knox Presbyterian Church. If you have books to return, we will be happy to accept them.



### Looking for Quilting ideas?




