Prior to the sale—

Organize and Categorize your stuff:

Organize similar items into Distinct Categories:

Magazines, patterns, notions, quilt fabric, fat quarters, fabric strips, fabric scraps, upholstery fabric, felt, thread, yarn, rulers, tools, batting, embellishments, orphan blocks, UFOs, quilt tops, and even completed quilts will be accepted. One member is bringing an old sewing machine to sell. *Books and magazines will have a separate table.*

No patterns from Stitches and Stuffing—old and outdated

No books or magazines with copyright before 2000.

BUNDLE AT EVERY OPPORTUNITY--Bundle similar items together in clear plastic bags. (thread, fabric scraps, zippers, strips from same line of fabric...) and price accordingly with Sharpie marker. There will be a separate section for Christmas, Halloween, and Fall fabrics.

PRICE EVERYTHING (except patterns \$1, books \$3 and fabric—which we will weigh.) No need to measure your fabric. No prices less than \$1

WEIGHING the FABRIC—One pound of quilting cotton is approximately 3 yards. We will sell most fabric for \$10/pound, which works out to about \$3/yard.

RQG will ACCEPT-- Cash, Checks, Credit Cards

Leftovers will be taken to local charity thrift shops.

Bring shopping bags for yourself and others.


