Pet Beds for Philanthropy

Some of us (Rita F., Heidi E., Carol R., Judy L., Rosemary S., and Lynn S.) have been making pet beds for Philanthropy. Norma Beckemeier has cut and sewn over 25 pet bed covers from Philanthropy fabric and also fabric left over from the January Rummage Sale. To stuff the beds we used our own scraps of fabric and batting and also leftover scraps and very outdated fabric from the Rummage Sale. We are in need of your cut up scraps of fabric and batting. To cut up the fabric/batting, place it on your cutting mat and slice it into approximately 2" strips. Then slice them again so your scraps are not much larger than 2" x 2". No precision necessary! Large lumps of fabric are not comfy for the dogs and cats who will use these beds. Batting can be either cotton, cotton blend or poly,. etc. Bring your scraps in a closed grocery bag to the philanthropy table at the next meeting.
