Nancy S. bound two quilts, Judy L. bound one quilt, Eileen T. bound one quilt, Darlene E. completed a quilt, Lynn H. bound one quilt, Margaret Z. bound one quilt, there was a donation of 20 pillowcases from a guild quilt angel, and Leesa J. bound one quilt. We prepared three quilt kits to be completed and one found a home.

December Report:

It was another productive month from members. Thank you so much. We received two quilt tops from Judy L., Norma B. completed nine quilts, Nancy S. bound 3 quilts, Lynn S. completed 2 quilts, Linda Y completed four quilts, and Jen B. cleaned her sewing room and completed 6 quilts. So sew impressive. We prepared eight kits and one quilt to be bound. Four quilts were taken to be completed and the quilt to be bound also found a member. With all this inventory we were able to distribute many quilts and pillowcases. At the December meeting, a guild member received three quilts to be delivered to a family of three boys who recently lost their mother in a car accident. We also went to Northwestern Medical Center in Winfield and delivered 15 children's quilts and 15 pillowcases. The next stop was Habitat for Humanity of DuPage County where we donated four quilts and four pillowcases. They will be distributed in a January and February dedication. Judy and I are hoping to be involved in the February dedication. Our last stop was the Humane Society where we dropped off a pet bed. It was gladly received and more will be welcome. Thank you for the scraps. Please keep them small, approximately 5 inch square or smaller, cotton or batting pieces welcome.

In January philanthropy will not have a table set up because of the winter celebration and rummage sale. We will accept completed projects. Thank you members for donating your time and materials. We hope we recognized everyone that helped with philanthropy and hope we did not forget anyone.
