## Catherine Redford **Most Excellent Adventures in Quilting**

June 14, 2016 Program



Catherine Redford was brought up in the northwest of England, the "middle child" with an older brother and a younger sister. She learned to knit and sew at an early age and kept her family's Barbie Dolls and Action Men well dressed. University years took her to Reading where she met her future

husband, Steve. Knitting him a long "Doctor Who" style striped scarf and making needlepoint pictures gave welcome relief to the chemistry and microbiology courses demanded for her degree in Food Science. They married two weeks after she graduated and moved to Naperville in 1995. Now 35 years later they have four grown children. In 1998, Catherine discovered guilting and took her first class at Stitches and Stuffing in Naperville. Five years later she started teaching classes at Pieceful Heart Fabrics in Lisle. Catherine is a member of our Riverwalk Quilters Guild where she has served as program chair, vice-president, cochair of "the Gathering" committee, and also a 2 year term as president. She is a member of the Fiber Art Divas, an art group that meets at Naperville Art League and or PAQA, the professional art quilt group. In 2012 Catherine co-founded the Naperville Modern Quilters Guild to further explore the modern quilt

aesthetic. She now teaches on land and sea, on TV and DVD. In 2013 Catherine was invited to appear on Quilting Arts TV and has since taped several segments. A regular contributor to Modern Patchwork magazine, she has also authored two Modern Machine Quilting Quilting Arts TV workshop DVDs.

The class will be particularly useful for the "too timid to stitch" quilters out there or "tried it and didn't enjoy it" quilters, or maybe "just want to be better" quilters.



After a varied career in the design world, Jane began to quilt in 1980. She found that these "soft paintings" satisfied the draftsman, the craftsman and the artist in her. She is now a dedicated (some say "obsessed") quilt artist and fabric designer.

Jane's art quilts have been shown in many national and international exhibits including Quilt National 1989–2005 and Contemporary American Quilts, the first major exhibit of American art quilts in England. Her quilt "Willow" was named as One of the One Hundred Best American Quilts of the Century. Jane is also the author of *The Quilted Garden* which includes twenty years of her work and exercises for making nature-inspired quilts.

Jane's love for historic decorative arts is especially evident in the exuberant fabric she is designing for FreeSpirit. Her designs are oversized and colorful and have been coined as "William Morris on anti-depressants". They are created for quilts, wearables and home decorating. Her latest book, *Patchwork*




