Show Shop Hidden Treasures

Don't delay in donating your items for the RQG quilt show shop, Hidden Treasures. We need your fabric, patterns, books, etc. sooner rather than later, so we can sort the fabric by size and the books and patterns by content. This takes longer than you might think.

Below are some guidelines to help you with your donation:

- ♦ No fabrics smaller than 2-1/2" square please.
- ♦ Good quality quilting fabric.
- Mark size of each piece of fabric (fat quarter or larger) if possible.
- ♦ Wool fabric is acceptable.
- Both new and antique quilts and tops are acceptable.
- Fabric panels are acceptable, as are orphan blocks.
- ♦ Complete Kits--finished or unfinished
- Patterns
- Quilting books--fiction or non-fiction.

We are sorting fabric by size--fat quarter, 1/4 yard, 1/3 yard, 1/2 yard, 2/3 yard, 3/4 yard, etc. and, if we have time, by color.

We will have **bags of good-sized scraps** sorted by color in clear plastic bags—no mystery bags.

We will have bags of strips of all sizes for stripy quilts.

You can bring your donations to our March 12 Riverwalk meeting, but it would be even better if you can drop them off at my house. Contact me using the RAG Directory before coming to my house.



Please make sure you read all quilt show articles that follow. Your committee is working hard to make our show a super success.





Please remember to consider entering the quilts you've made in the last 3 years. We really are hoping to get at least ONE quilt from every guild member. In addition, there's still room in the youth category. Please encourage young people in your life to give quilting a try!

At the end of the newsletter are the quilt show registration forms. We encourage you to make copies of your registration forms prior to turning the forms in. Please print your forms and drop them off with us at our next guild meeting.

Note: There's a sleeve requirement for any quilts over 36". Please see the link on the Riverwalk website for "How to make

The next step will include the information on how to prepare you quilt for the show. For example, every quilt will need a pillowcase and an identifying label for both the pillowcase and the quilt. You will receive this information in April. These items will need to be prepared prior to the drop off weekend of May 4 & 5. (Drop off addresses will follow.)
