CRITICAL Position Open: We NEED YOU!

Hello Riverwalk Quilters-

Typically, in May, the guild would be voting on the new slate of officers for the upcoming 2018-19 year. We can't do that however, because we are missing one critical chairperson from the slate.

According to our bylaws: Section 10.02 The Guild shall be considered dissolved if there are an insufficient number of nominees for the Guild Board election to fill all executive offices and the membership, program, newsletter and program planning committee chair position. If other committee chairs are not filled, that function will not be available to the Guild for that year.

So, unfortunately, we must once again turn to you and ask that someone step up and fill the Program Planning (aka Contracts/Programs) position on the upcoming slate for the 2018-2020 year. As you can see, this is a critical position for us to fill, and according to our own by laws, we cannot be a guild without it filled. If this position is not filled, the guild must officially dissolve.

In the April newsletter, I explained this situation in my President's letter. I said "If you want to be the one to select all our guild programs and work closely with those teachers the following year, we'd love to have you consider this position. We increased the budget so that we can have the very best quilt educators come speak to our guild. This is a must-fill spot, and it's a simple one. Fill the months with speakers and workshops this year, and next year coordinate them to arrive and get set up to do their thing."

Contracts (and as Program host for the following year) is a position that requires some time and effort on the part of the volunteer. We understand that it's not a small job, but it's not a very hard one. We do not care if this position is held by one person or more than one. It has been held by an entire bee in the past. You can do it with a friend. But the position must be filled for us to continue on.

Sara Carroll, our current Contracts chairperson, who is transitioning to the Programs chairperson for the educators she has contracted with, is happy to help explain to you what she has done to complete the job this year. Sara has created an email template to inquire with educators to make reaching out to them easy. She's done a fantastic job this year.

Celeste Akre and Susan Akre have also done an amazing job as Programs co-chairs this year, completing their contracts with educators they contracted with the year prior. They can tell you what venues they have used to book workshops and also about our typical hotel and other arrangements an educator may need.

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I know that, for almost two years, my presidency has been marked with near constant begging for volunteers to step up and take over certain positions so that we may continue to enjoy those things. I realize that many of you have served on the board in the past and feel you may have done your duty to the guild. I know that some of you have had a difficult time on previous boards or were asked to do more than you should have or did your work with no recognition for your efforts. I'm sorry that happened to you. But what I do know is that NOW is the time for you to seriously think about whether you can serve the guild in this capacity. If you can serve, we NEED you to serve.

Here's the official job description from the By Laws and Policies and Procedures:

By Laws: a) PROGRAM PLANNING:

- 1)Serves a two-year term. The first year shall be as Program Planning Chair and as the second as Program Chair.
- 2)Plans programs and workshops for the upcoming Guild year and submits them to the Board for consideration and review.
- 3)Presents program plans for the upcoming Guild year at the year-end Transition Board Meeting.
- 4)Provides information on upcoming programs and workshops for the Guild newsletter and website.
- 5)Provides information on upcoming programs and workshops for the Guild newsletter and website.
- 6)In alternate years, the Program Planning Chair will secure the speaker for the next Quilt Show.

b) PROGRAMS:

- 1)Administers all programs and workshops for the current Guild year.
- 2)Provides information on programs for the newsletter.
- 3)Serves as liaison to speakers and workshop presenters.
- 4) Works with other committees on workshops and programs as necessary

- 5)Arranges for housing, meals and transportation of guest speakers as needed.
 6)Publicizes and promotes workshops and Guild programs.
- PP: 7.10 The Program Planning Chair is responsible for corresponding and contracting with speakers and for preparing the program and workshop schedule one year or more in advance. The Chairperson should also prepare an estimated budget for the next year's programs, as well as a list of programs, speakers, and workshops for publication in the July newsletter and for posting on the RWQG website.
- 7.11 The Program Planning Chair should try to provide a wide range of programs reflecting the different interests and skill levels of the Guild membership. She/He also shall attempt to offer at least one program a year by a non-traditional quilter or on a non-traditional or ethnic quilting style.
- 7.12 The Programs Chair may recruit RWQG members in good standing to serve as Workshop Hostesses. These hostesses should be carefully trained to serve as the official Guild representative at RWQG-sponsored workshops. They will provide or arrange transportation for the workshop presenter, assist the presenter in conducting the workshop as necessary, and coordinate any needed set-up and clean-up of speaker materials or equipment. In return, workshop hostesses do not have to pay the workshop registration fee. They are responsible for any material or kit fees that may apply.

If you can be the Contracts/Programs person for the 2018-2020 years, email me directly at Quilts@muppin.com. If we do not have a person in place by the May meeting, we will not be able to present the slate and must start proceedings to wind up the guild's affairs.




June 12 Sassafras Lane

General Information:

- You must be a member of RQG to participate
- \$5 entry fee due at May guild meeting (refundable if challenge is completed).
- 3. Only one entry per person
- 4. First available entry date is March 13, 2018
- 5. Finished projects due on June 12, 2018
- Voting for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd.
 Voting will take place at the June
 Guild meeting by those in
 attendance. One vote per entry,
 please.
- 7. Prizes will be awarded at the June Guild meeting.
- All entries may be exhibited at local venues to spread word of our quilting passions

Rules:

- 1. Make a quilt/wall hanging using Book theme.
- 2. Any style may be used: traditional, modern, contemporary, art
- 3. Finished perimeter can be no more than 100".
- 4. The quilt must be completely finished (quilts must have two layers of cloth filled with batting and be quilted or tied).
- 5. Attach a sleeve on the back.
- 6. Include a label on the back with your name and phone number
- 7. You may add any embellishments.
- 8. Fill-in the entry form and bring it with the quilt to the June Guild Meeting
