How do they know when it's time to fly down South? Do they have an internal GPS to find their way? I guess I will have to Google it to find the answers. And below is what I found.

First, monarch butterflies have a circadian rhythm that helps them know what time it is. Think about when you wake up, you can probably guess close to what time it is before glancing at your phone. Or you look outside, and the position of the sun will help you figure out the time, even without a clock.


Monarch butterflies also utilizing that innate sense of time as well as the sun's position to orient themselves in a southwestern direction.

However, on cloudy days, monarch butterflies can't use the sun's position to help them. On those days, they use the earth's magnetic pull to tell which direction is south. Geomagnetic cues help them fly toward the equator, and those magnetic receptors have been found to be in the butterflies' antennae.

Quite amazing creatures, they are, and the Monarch butterflies can live from 7 to 9 months and how do they take that long trip to Mexico without luggage? LOL
