Glad so many, 51, were able to join Julia Graves in Oct. for her interesting presentation on choosing fabrics of different colors and how they complement each other in our quilts.

Nov. 10 – ReNae Merrill – will give a Zoom presentation on "Free Motion Quilting Mastery in one month". *Free-Motion Mastery in a Month* breaks down the process of learning free-motion quilting into individual skills. You learn each skill separately, then put them together for quilting success.

There are 31 guided daily lessons. Each lesson contains three types of exercises: Tracing, Drawing and Quilting. Each exercise plays a different and important role in mastering free-motion quilting.

Because you're practicing the right things, the right way, in the right order, you really can learn to do freemotion quilting in as little as a month. Although many already do free motion quilting, she has a different approach and will give us some new ideas.

On Sat. Nov. 7, Rosemary will send out the Zoom link, ReNae's lecture guide and a shape tracing sheet to print out before the meeting. Thanks Rosemary! I'm looking forward to a great lecture.

Connie Martin will give a historical presentation, "Pre-Civil War Quilts: Their Secret Codes to Freedom on the Underground Railroad." This is a multimedia experience including intro. music, PowerPoint slide presentation, storytelling, and explanation of 18 beautifully hand-crafted quilt replicas, representing quilt patterns and special stitching used over 300 years ago by abolitionists and fugitive slaves to signify escape routes to the North.

It is based upon her mother's book: Lizzie's Story: A Slave Family's Journey to Freedom." By Dr. Clarice Boswell. (Amazon.com). She will tell the fascinating family stories of how these quilt codes were used by her ancestors. Their meanings and interpretations have been passed down to her; a 6th generation descendant of captured American slaves.



designing and piecing literally dozens of different designs and make fabulous quilts.

Amy is a former museum curator who is now a quilt pattern designer and author. She enjoys making modern quilts and paper piecing.

She has authored three books: Intentional Piecing (all about fussy cutting and the best use of your fabric), Improv Paper Piecing (about her innovative technique combining the improv aesthetic with the paper piecing technique) and Petal + Stem (mix and match flower and stem blocks). She lives in Massachusetts with her husband and three kids, loves gardening and baking.

May 11, 2021 - Ruth Ann Berry – Lecture/ trunk show BARGELLO, 3 D, PANELS,

Ruth Ann Berry is the author of "Bargello Quilts in Motion", C&T Publishing 2014, "Braided Bargello", C&T Publishing 2017, Simplified 3D Quilts, self-published 2018, Stunning 3D Quilts Simplified, C&T Publishing 2020 and over 50 quilt patterns available at major distributors. She owns and operates a small-town quilt store and online business, the "Quilter's Clinic" and travels extensively to exhibit and teach at guilds and festivals.

For her Zoom Presentation/Trunk Show, she will show many quilts, in three different styles: Bargello, 3D, and Stacked Frames. She gives a brief history and explanation of the design process and demonstrates the construction techniques for each style. She has books, patterns and kits for sale. June 8, 2021 - Betsy Habich – DESIGNING AND MAKING A PIECED PICTURE QUILT WITH FREEZER PAPER.

Starting with a description of early quilts, Betsy explains how she began designing picture quilts to achieve more realistic images by piecing with freezer paper templates. The freezer paper template method frees you from the perfect 1/4" seam by marking and sewing on the seam. Unlike paper piecing, freezer paper templates let you use curved seams, and let you easily audition fabric.

The first part is a slide + trunk show, covering both what works and what not to do. The second part takes you from photograph to quilt top, including designing the pattern, checking it for piece-ability, making the freezer paper templates, selecting fabric, mockingup, marking, and sewing.

Betsy Habich has been sewing since the third grade. Her quilts have been juried into national and regional shows, including International Quilt Association (IQA/Houston), American Quilters Society (AQS/Paducah), Machine Quilters Expo (MQX), and Quilters Gathering, and been awarded ribbons at regional quilt shows.

She is a self-confessed fabricaholic and cat person. She lives with her husband, cats, and fabric in Beverly Farms, MA, a coastal community north of Boston.

Thank you, guild members for your support with your time and materials. We hope we included everyone, and if we omitted anyone, we would like to know who we missed. We appreciate all you do.

Along with donations of fabric, quilt tops, binding, and quilting, guild members have been invited to give Christmas stockings and pillowcases to Open Door Organization in Sandwich. The organization provides opportunities for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities to enrich their quality of life.

They have asked us to help their clients receive stockings and pillowcases for the upcoming holidays. The request was for 65 of each. Currently we have 113 stockings and 22 pillowcases. We have reached our goal for stockings and are over a third of the way with the pillowcases. THANK YOU, guild members.

The extra stockings will have a home with Sharing Connections. We have 4 drop off places for the pillowcases and stockings, Margaret Zitt, Terri Hayes, Linda Kurz, and Rachelle Shaffer, all contact information is in the directory. Deadline is December 11th.

July 2020 Riverwalk Quilt Guild Challenge Stash Buster

Challenge: The 2020-2021 Stash Buster Virtual Challenge opened at our July Zoom meeting. As the title implies, we are to use our (or anyone's) stash. Attached are description and rules.

Eight members signed up for our challenge and six have sent a description and pictures of their projects. They include:

- Carol Gruchala is making 2 quilts from her stash of cat fabrics using Clarissa patterns and her stash of MB cat fabrics. The first quilt pattern is 'Cat Out of the Bag,' she has not decided on pattern for the second quilt but it will similar to bricks or squares.
- Carol Matlak is using her stash by making scrappy quilts to be donated to Habitat for Humanity in Will County. Patterns include 'Waterfall at Night' – batiks, 'Colors at Night' – batiks and 'Shots of Hungry Little Caterpillar.'
- 3) Kathleen Herbach is using 'Modern Birds in the Air' blocks from her stash.
- 4) Rita Farrell is making a scrappy quilt using Pat Sloan's 'Traffic Jam' from her stash.
- 5) Sharon Hallett Thomsen is using a quilt top 'Roots & Wings' she made in 2017 and a stack of unrelated quilt blocks and coordinating sashing's for the reverse side. Sharon pieced, machine quilted, and bound a beautiful quilt.
- 6) Darlene Ebel is making three lap quilts for hospice made of 12 vintage appliqued blocks and her stash of vintage fabrics and embellishments. Darlene will piece, machine quilt and bind lap quilts.
