We will hold the Guild Rummage sale again at the January meeting; however, we will **not** be selling quilting fabric, quilting patterns, or quilting books in January. Please save them for the Hidden Treasures area at our show next May. You can donate notions, non-quilting fabric, and magazines towards the January rummage sale.

If you would like, you can bring your quilting fabric to the November and December RQG meeting so that we can begin cutting and packaging it for the show shop. If you want to make up your own bag of 42 2-1/2" strips, you can bring these to our RQG meeting starting in November. I will have a donation box. You can also cut your fabric into fat quarters (18" x 22") but do not bag these as we will be securing them with painter's tape. Please mark your larger fabric pieces by size. That would help us a lot. Be somewhat choosy as to what quilting patterns you will donate--if they are very outdated, recycle them.

She has designed her own line of notions including Perfect Circles, Perfect Scissors, and Perfect Adjustable Rulers. She has completed over 350 quilts which have received numerous awards at shows around the country, been published in magazines and calendars, and even displayed in the US Capitol building. Her specialty is appliqué, both by hand and by machine.

During the guild meeting, Karen will take us on a journey through her growth as a quilter. We will see how her passion began with her first quilt and how she developed her technique and style throughout her years of experience up to the present day. She will share the important things she has learned along the way. Also included in the presentation is a virtual tour of Karen's home and quilt studio.

Join us for a one day hand appliqué workshop where Karen will teach her techniques for perfect points, curves, circles, and stems.
